Call Meeting to Order and Opening Remarks

Disclosure of Pecuniary Interest

Deputy Mayor Hart welcomed those in attendance and introduced Ross Gellately, Director of Public Works for the Township of South Stormont.

Public Meeting: Fly Creek Drain (Cedar Street/Fairground Drive Culvert Reconstruction)

Mr. Gellately provided an overview of the public meeting process and encouraged those in attendance to sign in and provide their contact information.

Mr. Gellately introduced Adam O'Connor, McIntosh Perry, to present the details of the drain improvements.

Mr. O'Connor explained that the road crossing culvert under Cedar Street and Fairground Drive is in poor condition and improvements to the capacity and alignment are required. This crossing is located along the Fly Creek Municipal Drain therefore, there are provisions in the Drainage Act must be followed for any improvements. As part of the construction of the Fly Creek Municipal Drain, an Engineers Report was prepared outlining the specific details of the drain, inclusive of culvert crossings. In order to modify portions of this drain, in any capacity, procedures under Section 78 of the Drainage Act are followed. Section 78 allows an appointed engineer to revise and update the particulars of a municipal drain, such as increasing the size of a culvert and changing the alignment. A new Engineers Report is then prepared reflecting the changes made by the Engineer to the Municipal Drain, Schedule of Assessment and/or supporting design information.

Mr. O'Connor advised that there were no comments received from circulated agencies, being Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs, Ministry of Natural Resources, South Nation conservation and the Raisin Region Conservation Authority.

Following the presentation, Deputy Mayor Hart invited questions from those in attendance.

Mark Larin, 13 Cedar Street, inquired whether sub drains will be connected to the new system and was advised that they would be.

John Brydges, 1 Cedar Street, inquired whether sump pump drain will be accommodated and was advised that it would be.

Yvan Shank, 7 Mill Street, inquired whether the project would be coordinated with the paving of Cedar St. and Fairground Dr. and was advised that it will be.

Christine Larin, 13 Cedar Street, inquired whether a stop sign will be installed at the intersection of Cedar St. and Fairground Dr. and was advised that the street width and radius at the corner will not be altered, however, further investigation concerning traffic control can be undertaken.

Bryan McGillis, 17298 Myers Road, sought clarification as to the cost of the project and was advised that the project will cost 1.7 million with 85% of funding being received through the Ontario Community Infrastructure Fund.

Deputy Mayor Hart expressed appreciation to those in attendance and adjourned the public meeting at 5:25 PM.
