**CHANGES TO WATER METER READINGS**

Quarterly water billings have been based on three actual meter readings (April, July, October) and one estimate (January) per year. In an effort to improve efficiencies, there will be four actual meter readings per year beginning December 1, 2018 and continuing every three months thereafter. The December 1, 2018 reading will be for a two month period (October & November). Your minimum water bill, for this period ONLY, will be based on usage of 25.66 cubic meters or less and your minimum amount payable will be reduced accordingly. **QUARTERLY UTILITY BILLING**

Utility bills have been mailed out and are due November 26th, 2018. Should you have any questions concerning your bill, or did not receive your bill, please contact Town Hall. Payments may be made by mail, online/telephone banking, pre-authorized payments, in person or via the drop box situated outside the front door of the Town Hall. When using online/telephone banking, make sure to quote the roll number listed on your Utility Billing and to use the right payee to ensure your payment is properly applied to your account. Please note that payments must be received by the due date to ensure no penalty will be applied.

**TAX AND WATER & SEWER PAYMENTS DURING POSTAL STRIKE**

Due to the postal strike, residents are encouraged to take steps to ensure payments are received prior to the due date to avoid penalties. A post-dated cheque may be submitted or mailed at any time to ensure payment is received on time. Residents are also encouraged to utilize other methods of payment such as online/telephone banking or pre authorized payment options which are available on a monthly or instalment basis for both Property Tax payments and Water and Sewer payments.

**SOUTH STORMONT IS AUTOMATING THE PAYMENT PROCESS**

In most cases, there are 2 (two) different payees on your bank list: one for your Property account and one for your Water/Sewer (Utility) account. Additionally, the roll numbers on your billing may be different depending on whether you are paying your Property taxes or your Water/Sewer (Utility) billings. In order to avoid penalties on your Property account or your Water/Sewer (Utility) account, please ensure to select the right payee from your bank list as well as the roll number provided on the respective billing when making online or telephone payments.

**MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS RESULTS**

The 2018 Municipal Elections have come and gone, and the Township of South Stormont will have a new Council.

In total, 48.19% of eligible electors cast their votes during the election, with 48% voting with paper ballots, while 52% chose to vote online.

**FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES**

South Stormont Fire and Rescue is urging everyone to keep fire safety in mind as the temperatures turn colder. Here are some simple things you can do to stay fire safe during the colder months:

- Have heating appliances serviced and chimney flues examined for defects by a qualified person.
- Have fireplaces and fireplace dampers checked.
- Fireplaces should be equipped with an appropriate screen or glass enclosure to prevent sparks from flying out.
- Wood burning stoves should be examined by a qualified person, and the flue and chimney checked for creosote buildup. Creosote is a deposit from incomplete combustion that can build up in a chimney and can start a fire.
- Use only dry seasoned woods, and avoid soft woods like Pine, etc.
- Never use a flammable liquid to start a fireplace.
- Never overload the hearth with wood or artificial logs, the resulting fire may be too large for the unit.
- Put all ashes outdoors and away from the house in a metal container.

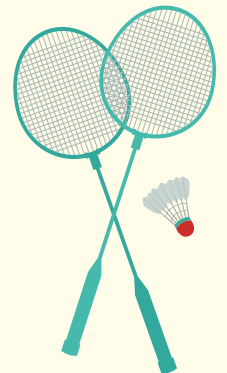
