SOUTH STORMONT FIRE AND RESCUE RECEIVES FIRE PROTECTION GRANT



Council was informed that South Stormont Fire and Rescue successfully secured a grant.

The Fire Protection Grant, awarded by the Province of Ontario in collaboration with the Office of the Fire Marshal, aims to support cancer prevention efforts in municipal fire departments.

The nearly \$33,000 in funding will be used to purchase a specialized washing machine and on-scene decontamination tools to reduce the risk of carcinogen exposure for firefighters.

LOST VILLAGES MUSEM RESTORATION UPDATE



Council heard of the ongoing restoration of two buildings at the Lost Villages Museum that were flooded over the winter. Both buildings have been decontaminated with electrical, furnace and air conditioning components replaced.

The damage has been investigated by an insurance adjuster and covered under the Township's insurance policy.

➤➤➤ GRANT APPLICATION SUBMITTED FOR MULTI-USE PATH EXTENSION

Council heard from the Director of Parks and Recreation of a grant application submitted to the Ontario Trillium Foundation to complete the final design and construction of Phase 1 of the multi-use recreational trail along the Long Sault Pipeline.



If successful, the grant will provide 100% funding for the project, totaling \$193,200.
