



COUNCIL CATCH UP

DRAFT SHOOTING RANGE LICENSING BY-LAW DISCUSSIONS



Council heard from two delegations regarding the DRAFT Shooting Range Licensing By-law. One Delegation represented the Cornwall Handgun Club, while the second was from a member of the public.

Each delegation shared concerns with the proposed by-law, and Council instructed staff to consider comments from each party and conduct additional research.

An updated proposed Shooting Range Licensing By-law is expected to be brought to Council for consideration in April.

BOIL WATER ADVISORY



The Director of Public Works updated Council about the recent Boil Water Advisory for Long Sault, Ingleside, and Osnabruck Centre.

A power surge caused pumps at the wastewater treatment plant to shut down, resulting in low pressure.

The alarm monitoring company failed to follow appropriate notification protocols and that to the low-pressure event.

Staff have made operational and mechanical changes and the alarm company have updated their protocols to prevent a recurrence.

Council was provided with a list of Township-owned parcels of land that administration recommended to be declared as surplus in preparation to market for sale.



Council accepted the recommendation, and Township staff will initiate the process for future sale.
